HIGHLIGHTED RULES for SETS & LIGHTS

VARSITY – *with changes to lighting in particular*: 8 minute limit; 1–4 participants \$100 spending limit per entry, not including black box. Required components:

- Designs for 3 sets, using set renderings and set model, with 1/2" scale.
- One light plot usable for all 3 sets, with complete lists of instrument number, channel number, dimmer number, color (if any), and any other pattern or accessories
- Instrument schedule: a spreadsheet of all lights organized by instrument number, showing also channel number, dimmer number, type of light, gobo (if any), color, watt draw, purpose, focus area or special use.
- Channel schedule: the same information in a spreadsheet, organized by channel.
- Color schedule: the same information in a spreadsheet, organized by color.
- Overhead chart for each set.
- Notebook, Concept Paper and the required information for them.

Optional:

 Magic Sheet – one page with all channel numbers for lights organized in best way for designer to access and use during rehearsals & performances.
