




FYI: Some DTASC Rules

- · The selection is to be memorized.
- No recording or photographing of scenes in any round is allowed. Doing so may violate copyright and student privacy laws.
- Sound effects are permissible, but only through the use of a participant's hands, feet, mouth, or chairs.
 - Students may vocalize background music without lyrics.
 - If a non-musical play includes a song, students may then sing lyrics.
- Any suggestive acting that denotes sexual activity of any kind except kissing and embracing is strictly forbidden in festival scenes and will result in disqualification.
 - · No kissing with tongues permitted.
 - For Middle School, kissing on the mouth is not permitted.
 - For Junior Varsity, only a quick nonsexual kiss on the mouth is permitted.
- · The playwright's lines must be used.
- Individual words or phrases may not be combined at random to create new lines.
- · Pronouns may be changed as needed.
- The playwright's intended tone must be preserved in all scenes unless specifically designated as a parody.

- Students presenting a virtual design are responsible for bringing appropriate technology (digital or printed) to share with judges. (Please download the files; do not count on internet access.)
- · Inspiration board with concept.
- Theoretical construction budget.
- If set model is physical, \$100.00 materials budget is required, with receipts. (Materials needed for construction of black box to house set model do not need to be included in \$100.00 total.)
- Optional research notebook (Certificate of achievement awarded to best research notebook.)



- There is no max to the number of designers that may participate in the creation of each design; however, all designers must be students enrolled at your school.

F4 COSTUMES / MAKEUP - Required Elements (ALL Divisions)

FIRST CHOICE (With Model)

- Three (3) color costume renderings with fabric swatches, identified by character name.
- Color makeup renderings with makeup schedule one for each costume. Include brand charts.
- Fully realized costume for one of the renderings. \$100.00 allowed for materials. Receipts required.
- Costume may be on a mannequin brought by presenting school or on a human model.
- If the model is helping to describe the project, they count towards the max # of presenters..

SECOND CHOICE (No Model):

- If designs are completely virtual (no fully realized costume), then five (5) color renderings, identified by name, with fabric swatches, are required.
- Color makeup renderings with makeup schedule one for each of the 5 costumes. Include brand charts.
- Students presenting a virtual design are responsible for bringing appropriate technology (digital or printed) to share with judges. (Please download the files; do not count on internet access.)

FOR <u>ALL</u> COSTUME/MAKEUP ENTRIES (Model or No)

- · Inspiration board with concept paper.
- Theoretical costume / makeup construction budget for all renderings.
- Optional research notebook (Certificate of achievement awarded to best research notebook.)

REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL TECH EVENTS

- There are limits on the number of presenters that may be present in the competition room.
 - VARSITY: 1-4 presenters.
 - ·JV & MIDDLE SCHOOL: 1-6 presenters.
- · 8 min. limit for presentation.
- Presentations should always include reasons for choices - color, style, purpose, connection to the play, etc.
- Must explain concept, choices, materials, knowledge of play.
- Must include final design images.
