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Julius Caesar



Julius Caesar, one of the three rulers of Rome, is approached by a stranger, telling him to "beware the

Ides of March." Brutus and Cassius meet and tell of their suspicions about Caesar, foreshadowing the future events to come. Caesar is offered a crown three times, and refuses all three times. Still, Cassius is suspicious. Cassius and a group of conspirators meet at Brutus' house, with the intention to persuade him into joining their cause. They want to kill Caesar and appoint Brutus as one of the rulers.

Brutus is very troubled because of this, but refuses to tell his wife, Portia, what is happening. Calpurnia, Caesar's wife, dreams up Caesar's fountain running blood instead of water. She dreams of Romans washing their hands in his blood on the Ides of March. She begs him not to go to the Senate meeting, but he ends up going anyway.

Caesar is stabbed by each of the Romans who attended the meeting at

Brutus' house. He dies. Mark Antony, Caesar's closest friend, is told to explain Brutus' actions to the public and tell them that his actions were honorable. Brutus wins over the crowd, but Mark Antony comes with Caesar's dead body. He reads Caesar's will to the crowd, which promises land and money to all Roman citizens. The crowd is now very angry, now believing that Caesar's death was unjust. Mark Antony, Octavius (Caesar's nephew), and Lepidus join together to defeat the conspirators.

Portia, Brutus' wife, kills herself. Brutus and Cassius plan their battle against Mark Antony, Octavius, and Lepidus. Brutus sees Caesar's ghost and is very uneasy.

The battle rages all day long. Cassius sees that they are losing and tells his servant to kill him. After Brutus finds his dead body, he also commits suicide. Antony finds Brutus' body and orders a funeral before he and Octavius return to Rome.

Olivia mistakes Sebastian for Cesario (Viola) and wants to marry him. Orsino falls for Viola. Sebastian marries Olivia and Viola marries Orsino.






