



## Varsity Tech With Plenty of Entries

- Tabulations will determine the top 5 from each group, based on the judges' ballots for the 2 morning sessions.

- After lunch, when the acting groups have been given their semi-final rooms, the tech categories will be told who is moving on to finals.
- Finalists report immediately to the same room used for morning presentations.
- The same judges will be there with their ballots & share sheets from the morning, but now they will ask questions about the presentations and the work done preparing for them.
- The judges will combine their scores from the morning presentations and the afternoon Q&A session to determine who gets the trophies.



- Three (3) color costume renderings with fabric swatches, identified by character name, act, scene.
- Color makeup renderings with makeup schedule one for each costume, Include brand charts,
- Fully realized costume for one of the three renderings is required.
- Costume may be assembled, purchased, gathered or constructed, or a combination of these.
- Costume may be on a mannequin brought by presenting school or on a human model, or not on a model/mannequin of any kind.
- If the model is helping to describe the project, they count towards the maximum number of presenters.
- Maximum amount allowed for your fully realized costume: \$100.00. Receipts required. Accessories do not have to be included in the \$100.
- Anything borrowed or "found" must be listed at fair market value.
- Include design choices, practical choices, artistic choices in your presentation.
- Certificate of achievement awarded to best research notebook.






